

# WHAT'S IN SEASON?: A GUIDE TO LOCAL FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

## AN AVAILABILITY GUIDE FOR THE FRESHEST PICKS

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As warm weather makes its return, so do fresh vegetable and fruit crops across the province.

Ontario is known for its fertile growing conditions, so it shouldn't come as a surprise that there are plenty of options when it comes to locally grown food.

Here's a handy guide to help you know when your favourite fruit and vegetables are in season. All information comes from Foodland Ontario and is or-

ganized by when the crop first becomes available.

### JULY

- Beets have a long season, from July through April.
- Carrots have an even longer one, from July through May.
- Celery, corn, rapini, tomatoes, peppers and zucchini are in season from July through October.
- Garlic is in season from July through February.
- Apricots, currants and gooseberries are available

in July and August.

- Peaches, watermelon and blueberries all have a three-month window of availability, from July through September.
- Plums and raspberries stick around one month longer, available from July through October.

### AUGUST

- Pears are available from August through December.
- Grapes, muskmelon and nectarines are in season in August and September.
- Cranberries and eggplant are available from August through October.
- Leeks are in season from August through February.
- Parsnips have an even longer season, available

from August through April.

- Squash is available from August to March.

### SEPTEMBER

- Brussels sprouts are in season from September through November.

• Red onions' season runs from September through April.

- Pumpkins come into season in September and last until October.

### YEAR-ROUND

- Potatoes, rutabaga, sprouts, sweet potatoes,

cooking onions, mushrooms and greenhouse lettuce and cucumbers are available all throughout the year.
