Ontario is known for its fertile growing conditions, so it shouldn't come as a surprise that there are plenty of options when it comes to locally grown

Here's a handy guide to help you know when your favourite fruit and vegetables are in season. All information comes from Foodland Ontario and is organized by when the crop first becomes available.

- · Beets have a long season, from July through April.
- Carrots have an even longer one, from July through May.
- · Celery, corn, rapini, tomatoes, peppers and zucchini are in season from July through October.
- Garlic is in season from July through February.
- Apricots, currants and gooseberries are available


