A garden at St. Jean de Parkette Brebeuf Vaughan was dedicated to the late community-builder Tony Alati on his birth-

On April 3, 2020, Alati died with the COVID-19 virus. He is remembered as a loving husband, father, son, brother and coach to many young athletes.

Alati was a passionate sports fan who played baseball for the Vaughan World Series Slo-Pitch Baseball League with the Hornets and Orioles. He later served as vice-president of the league and helped coordinate and support more than 46 teams.
