YOUR COMMUNITY IS AT A CROSSROADS

3 million homes are needed by 2030 to house all Canadians. Canada is in a housing crisis.

The average monthly cost to feed a family of four is \$1,106. Inflation has caused a cost-of-living crisis.

And to afford a one-bedroom apartment in York Region, an employee must earn \$24/hour. Minimum wage falls short, pushing people into poverty.

While the escalating costs are impacting everyone, vulnerable people feel it the most. More grandparents, teenagers, newcomers, and families are on the brink of or experiencing homelessness.

While the challenges continue piling up, community champions like you and the dedicated Blue Door team rallied together in 2023 and rapidly expanded solutions to meet community needs, helping to prevent and end homelessness.

Driven to increase emergency housing to meet the rising need, in partnership with the Regional Municipality of York and faith communities, our Mosaic Interfaith Out of the Cold program expanded for the season, adding 2 new sites and 34 more beds.

Expanding further, Blue Door supported York Region on a **new family emergency housing site** run out of a local hotel, providing ~15 more beds to families in need. To meet the needs of York Region's aging population, Blue Door's Forward program for senior men also increased in size and put down permanent roots.

Furthermore, together with your support and four incredible partners, Blue Door began the Housing For All Land Trust. The first of its kind in York Region, the land trust is seeking support to add properties to its portfolio in 2024, **increasing the deeply affordable housing supply in perpetuity**.

As part of our health strategic program priority, in partnership with the Region of York, health supports doubled through the hiring of another Hospital In-Reach Worker and a part-time Registered Practical Nurse.

In 2023 the Health Hub saw remarkable results, by providing on-site access to a Registered Nurse **calls to EMS dropped by 50%**, demonstrating the lifesaving impact of providing both housing and health supports.

Addressing homelessness by removing barriers to employment, Construct grew rapidly. The program delivered 30 cohorts providing **over 300 individuals** with skills, on-the-job training at projects such as York University and Sherbourne Health, and support to earn a living wage and have meaningful careers as apprentices.

We are deeply proud and truly thankful for all of the efforts of the Blue Door team in 2023.

All of the growth, ability to rapidly respond to community needs, and build meaningful solutions, is made possible by you.

We are so grateful to you for showing your support each and every day.

The hill is steep, and the stakes are high, but with your ongoing support our team is ready and the future is bright.

Together, we can and will end homelessness.

EMERGENCY HOUSING

Emergency housing programs provide more than just a bed to sleep in, they offer extensive wraparound supports including health and employment services, and assist in attaining and retaining housing.

In 2023, Blue Door expanded our support for families by partnering with a Vaughan hotel to support an additional 20 families who are unhoused in York Region with 3 additional rooms added during cold weather alerts.

Kevin's Place also expanded its capacity to 10 men in York Region ages 16+ to address the gap in support for unhoused men.

FINDING HOPE: JOHN'S JOURNEY


In May, John fled their home country in Africa, escaping the ravages of civil war and seeking a better life in Canada. **Upon arrival, they faced an unexpected hurdle: needing a work permit to find employment.** This led to a period of homelessness while they waited for the necessary documentation.

John's refuge came about six months in when they found Blue Door's Kevin's Place, an organization that became a sanctuary.

At Blue Door, John was **provided with crucial support to obtain a work permit** and Social Insurance Number. They were also assisted in finding employment and securing housing. During a difficult time, John was met with unmatched kindness and respect.

The team at Blue Door's Kevin's Place went above and beyond paperwork and housing; they provided access to a free gym, English classes, and unwavering emotional support.

Each staff member's dedication played a pivotal role in John's journey toward stability and success. Their efforts helped them **transition from a state of uncertainty to one of hope and opportunity**. John has since found employment, a place to call home, and gained the confidence to build a new life in Canada.

SEASONAL EMERGENCY HOUSING

Mosaic Interfaith Out of the Cold, a program by Blue Door, provides seasonal emergency housing seven days a week from October to June for youth, adults, and seniors experiencing homelessness in York Region.

In 2023, the program increased its nightly capacity at existing sites to 30 individuals and operated out of one of our five faith-based community partner locations.

In the fall of 2023, the program expanded to a new overflow site at Victory Baptist Church in East Gwillimbury, serving 20 individuals per night and offering an additional 6 beds during cold weather alerts.

> Nearly 1 in 3 individuals experiencing homelessness present themselves as seniors (55+).



TRANSITIONAL AND SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

Transitional housing provides longer-term housing and supports to help individuals and families overcome barriers to attaining and retaining stable housing. By offering a structured environment and comprehensive support, transitional housing helps residents build the skills and stability needed to secure permanent housing and improve their overall quality of life.

INNCLUSION

Provides safe and affirming transitional housing to 2SLGBTQ+ youth at risk of or experiencing homelessness in York Region.

PASSAGE

A transitional housing program, Passage House serves adult males and provides wraparound supports and skills to access and find stable housing.

ABODE

Welcoming an increasing number of newcomers and larger families, Abode provides the necessary time and support for families to establish themselves and secure housing.



FORWARD

Providing dignified tailored assistance to empower senior men in securing independent and accessible housing.

With the support of United Way Greater Toronto and the Government of Canada, through Reaching Home: Canada's Homelessness Strategy, a new property was purchased and renovated by Blue Door's social enterprise Construct, offering supportive housing for 5 senior men.

HEALTH HUB

Offers on-site medical support from a Registered Practical Nurse and Family Physician to individuals staying at Passage House, Porter and Leeder Place.

HOSPITAL IN-REACH

Working with the medical teams at Southlake Regional Health Centre, the Hospital In-Reach Worker advocates for individuals experiencing homelessness to ensure they have a safe place to go when leaving the hospital.

HOUSING RETENTION

Provides six months of various supports related to retaining stable housing, to individuals transitioning from emergency housing into the community.

HOUSING TO HEALTH

In partnership with LOFT Community Services and the Krasman Centre, program participants receive case management, peer support, and housing market support to attain and retain stable housing.

FROM STRUGGLE TO STRENGTH

Ahmed, Fatima, and their young son, Malik, fled their home country and arrived in Canada, driven by dreams of a better life. Their initial days were filled with challenges, and the daunting task of navigating an unfamiliar society. Despite these obstacles, **they remained steadfast in their aspirations, determined to establish a place they could call home**.

Their first taste of stability came with a temporary reprieve from uncertainty. However, this relief was fleeting as they faced multiple relocations due to inadequate and sometimes hostile living conditions. Each move brought renewed anxiety and despair, threatening their hopes.

Undeterred, Ahmed and Fatima's resilience shone through as they advocated for their rights and sought better opportunities. **Their perseverance paid off when they finally secured a modest apartment in a vibrant neighbourhood,** where diversity was a comforting presence.

With stable housing, they could now address their immigration issues. Compassionate advocates and the Housing Retention team guided them through the complex process, connecting them to supports, and slowly, the barriers began to fall, revealing a path to a brighter future.

Meanwhile, Malik, eager to support his family, sought employment. His persistence was rewarded with a job, providing additional income and easing some of the financial strain. As days turned into weeks and weeks into months, the family became woven into the fabric of their new community. They celebrated milestones, formed friendships, and embraced new opportunities with open hearts and unwavering determination.

Throughout their journey, they found hope in their resilience and the promise of a brighter tomorrow.

CONSTRUCT: A SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

Construct is a solution to end homelessness by providing individuals at risk of or who have recently experienced homelessness with in-class training, wraparound supports, and hands-on experience in the construction industry.

Participants engage in a seamless "recruitment to employment" process that prepares vulnerable youth and adults to secure well-paying and in-demand careers in the construction trades.

Construct furthered its partnerships in 2023 by developing a new partnership with Toronto and Region Conservation Authority at Kortright Centre for Conservation to learn about and gain hands-on experience in renewable and sustainable construction through their Sustainable Technologies Evaluation Program. RISING FROM ADVERSITY

As a single mother of three and a domestic violence survivor, Elena faced unimaginable hardships. Starting over was daunting, and maintaining a stable home was nearly impossible with the high cost of living and the sole responsibility of supporting her children.

Elena felt alone, battling depression, and struggling to interact with her children. Worry about money consumed her, and the threat of eviction loomed large. After job hunting for months, Elena came across the Construct program.

Elena began her journey with Construct, feeling a spark of hope. The program equipped her with the tools and certifications needed to succeed in the construction field, especially as a minority woman.

Through the training partners at Construct, Elena learned hands-on skills, including making a concrete bench and completing a solo project—a workhorse. After eight weeks, she graduated from Construct, and within a week, became a first-year apprentice.

Elena was overjoyed after signing union papers, knowing they could finally support their family without financial worry.

The Construct team worked with Elena to provide gas money, groceries, temporary housing, and psychotherapy, offering support beyond her expectations. Their help was invaluable.

Elena was hired by a restoration company shortly after exiting the program, becoming one of the few women on the job site and paving the way for herself and her children.

The Good Food Impact alleviates and provides educational resources on food insecurity and its root causes. They prepare nutritious and delicious individual-portion meals, for anyone in the community to access. Monthly, they donate meals to Blue Door's transitional housing programs and in 2023, provided over 8,300 meals.



Blue Door's Housing for All Land Trust will work to obtain and hold accessible and deeply affordable housing for the community. The land trust will engage with community members, developers, and municipalities to acquire and manage properties indefinitely.



BUILDING BRIGHTER FUTURES AHEAD

KEVIN'S PLACE RE-DEVELOPMENT

Together with EllisDon Community Builders, Blue Door will redevelop Kevin's Place, a 100-year-old residential house in Newmarket occupying less than roughly 30% of the property. Demonstrating responsible land use, Blue Door will develop a 14-unit purpose-built townhouse, offering emergency and affordable housing, and tripling the number of people housed.

EXPANDING EAST

Blue Door is thrilled to begin operating the Region of Durham's new 47-unit Beaverton Transitional Supportive Housing residence. This facility provides longer-term housing and comprehensive wraparound supports. Each unit offers a comfortable living space, promoting security and dignity. This initiative marks a significant step in addressing homelessness and housing insecurity in Durham, demonstrating Blue Door's commitment to building resilient communities through compassionate support services.
